

Northeastern Center Emergency Services received approximately 2,258 calls in FY23 with approximately 416 calls from Noble County.



Substance Use Disorder Services Provided in Noble County

Intermediate Group, Individual Counseling, and Intensive Counseling. Motivational Interviewing and CBT/Cognitive Behavioral Therapy.

The level of care is determined by uniform assessment tools (ANSA for adults, CANS for children/adolescents) and standardized admission criteria policy. Treatment philosophy, principles, and core values incorporate SAMHSA (Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration) and NIDA (National Institute on Drug Abuse) guidelines.

Northeastern Center strives to identify substance use issues during pregnancy, to provide early intervention and treatment to women to ensure healthy pregnancies and healthy infants. Without early interventions, the effects of substance use while in utero can cause life-long challenges. Additionally, untreated substance use disorders negatively affect the family unit. To be most effective, providers must be aware of the unique treatment barriers that single women with dependent children may face.



Top Diagnosis Categories for Children and Adolescents


